Cookies are text files that are placed on your computer or device by a website.

### HOW MIGHT WE USE COOKIES?

We may use cookies in a number of ways, the main purpose being to provide you with optimised content and allow you get the best experience whilst browsing. We do not use cookies to acquire personal information about you or others.

If you were ever to receive email marketing communications from Stonehouse Legal Services, cookies may be embedded. These cookies are used to track the opening of emails and help us to better target our products and services.
